



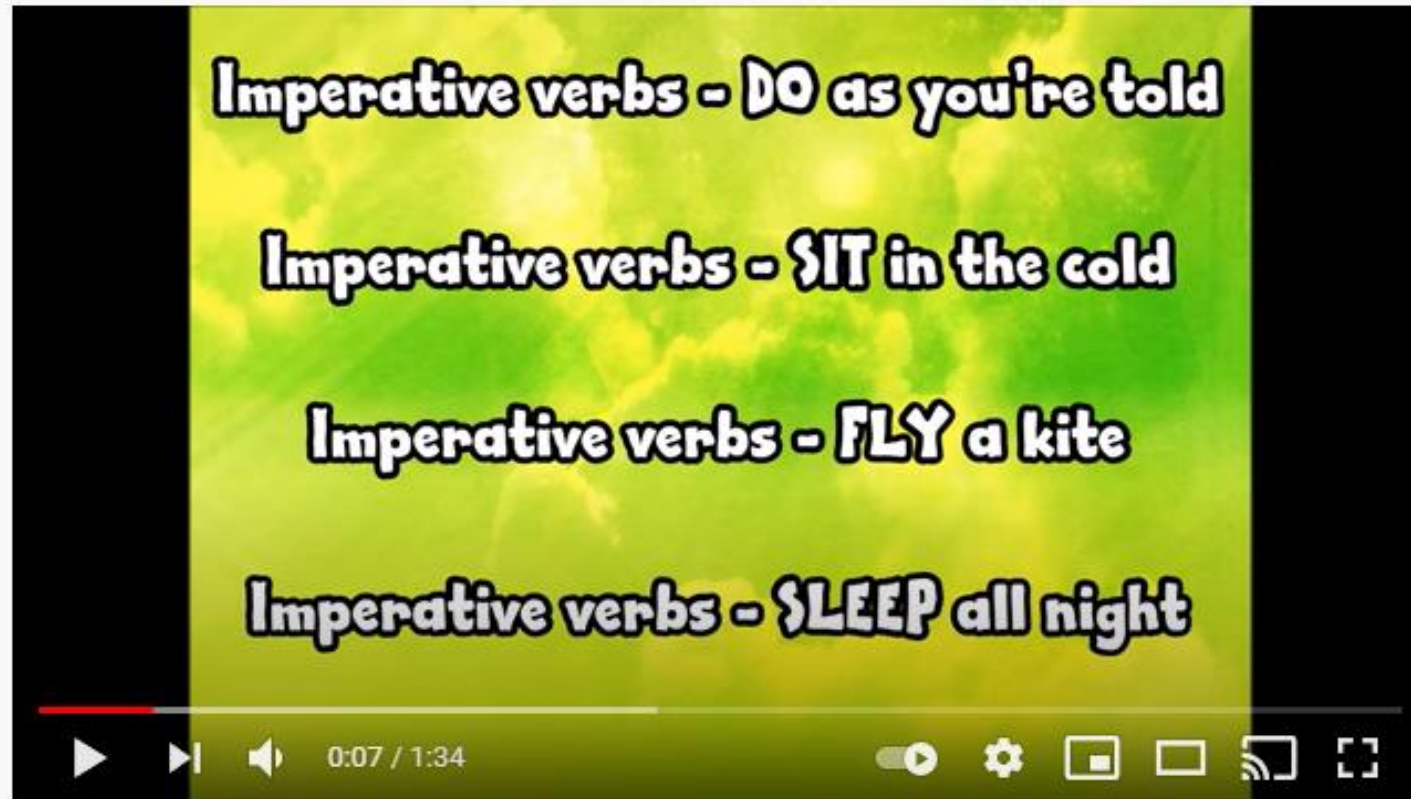

Well done! Imperative verbs tell us what to do. They are very bossy.

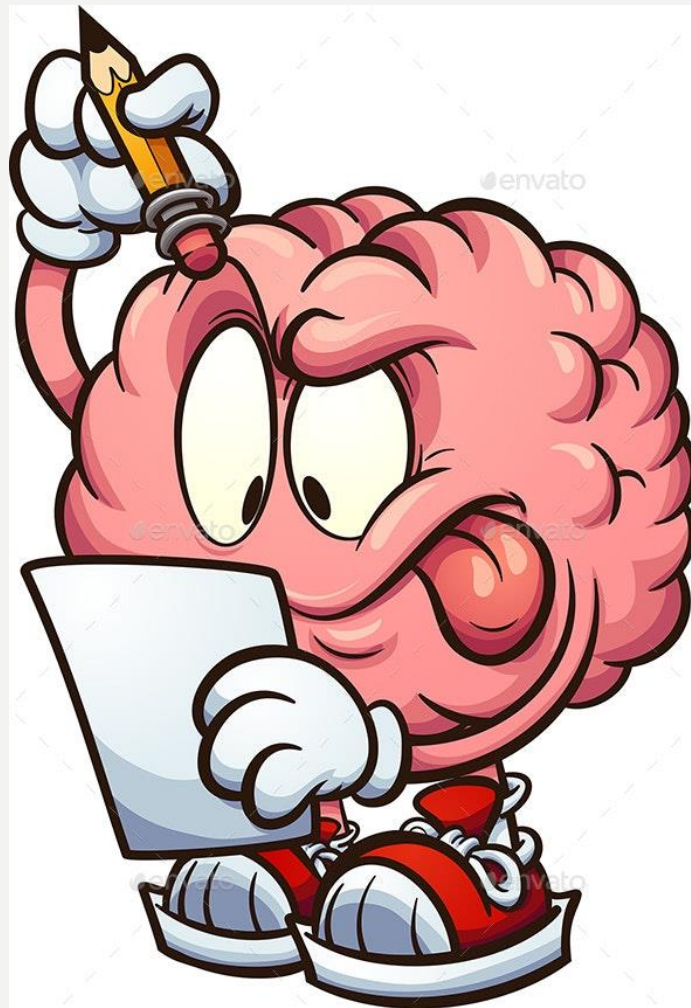
An example is...

This week, you are going to be creating your own mythical creature and writing a set of instructions about how to look after them. Today we will be creating our creatures!



On the next two slides are some mythical creatures/dragons that might inspire what you decide to draw. You might want to magpie parts of different creatures...

Here are some pictures of dragons that might inspire you.



I would now like you to draw your creature. You can use the pictures before for inspiration or you might want to copy your favourite.

Now we are going to write about our creature (just like we did last week with the dragon). First make a list of features of your creature under the heading nouns. Then see if you can think of adjectives to describe the features. Look at your work from last week to help you.

(Recap)

The next step is to think about which adjectives fit with which noun.

For example,

Dagger-like body
doesn't make sense.

Dagger-like teeth
makes sense.
