But they do not detail levels achieved in relation to national expectations as far as we could see (working towards, achieved or exceeded?) or where the child was in Sept versus now. I am roughly aware of where my child falls in that but it isn't communicated regularly or clearly.
- School meals could be healthier. This year group did get moved away from their peers each year, which was a shame. I think the school could do more sports events. Overall really pleased with the school and you take on parents And children feedback. Thank you

- We particularly appreciate how you managed the Covid-19 difficulties, and also the issues of the merger with the White Hills Trust. On the less positive side, we had one year (our daughter's year 2) when her class had at least 4 different teachers and a lack of continuity, with apparently quite poor hand-over leading to omission of parts from the curriculum, etc. We also felt that at times some teachers did not listen to us very well / act to follow up our concerns (note: we rarely had any!). Overall, we are very happy that our daughter has ended her time at primary school with a huge love of learning across all subjects. We appreciate the fact that the school has made learning fun for her (despite the changes to the national curriculum), and has nurtured her imagination and creativity.
