

Let's find out what rainforests are like. Watch and listen to this video carefully and write down all the different things you see and hear.






















If we are not Careful, this is all that will be left of the tropical rainforests.

And all the amazing plants, animals and insects that live in them die too.






Which Countries Have Rainforests?
