LAYERS OF THE RAINFOREST FACT FILE



EMERGENT LAYER

Conditions: It is very hot but also very breezy, wet and lacks shelter.

Plants: It is made up of the tallest trees in the rainforest.

Animals: Most of the creatures that live in the emergent layer are

birds like hummingbirds and macaws

Other interesting facts: The emergent layer isn't a very good

habitat for animals.

CANOPY LAYER

Conditions: There is lots of sunlight and plenty of rain.

Plants: The branches and leaves of the trees join up to form a roof

over the rest of the rainforest.

Animals: Animals that live here are arboreal meaning they live in

trees. This includes sloths, orangutans and red-eyed frogs.

Other interesting facts: The canopy is full of fruit and nuts all year.

UNDERSTORY LAYER

Conditions: The understory is very hot, dark and damp/humid As little as

1% of sunlight reaches this layer.

Plants: The understory is made up of bushes and small trees. Plants have

to grow larger leaves to reach the little sunlight there is.

Animals: The understory is home to insects, snakes and smaller animals.

Other interesting facts: Larger predators use the low trees to watch and pounce on their prey.

FOREST FLOOR LAYER

Conditions: It is dark and humid: almost no sunlight reaches this area.

Plants: Not many plants grow here. The forest floor is covered in

dead leaves.

Animals: The forest floor is home to the rainforest's largest animals

like jaguars, ocelots and elephants.

Other interesting facts: The dead leaves decompose and give nutrients

back to the soil to help other plants grow.
