| IMPORTANT<br>REMINDER<br>Track and Trace over<br>Half Term         | It is very important that parents continue to let us know of positive Covid-19 results even<br>after we break up on Friday 28 <sup>th</sup> May. Parents/Carers need to be ready for their child to<br>self-isolate should someone in their school bubble test positive after we break up.<br><b>How do I Report a Positive Covid-19 Test Result? (Including during Half Term)</b><br>If your child receives a positive test result, even during half term, you must complete our<br>electronic <u>Absence Daily Reporting Form</u> on the school website. This is the same Absence<br>Form we use for reporting daily absence. Do not leave a message on the school<br>answerphone nor ClassDojo as this will not be monitored during the half term holiday.<br>In addition, if your child is self-isolating due to a member of your household receiving a<br>positive result, should your child subsequently develop symptoms and also test positive,<br>please complete the <u>Absence Daily Reporting Form</u> to let us know.<br><b>How will you let us know if there is a positive test case when we are not at school?</b><br>If there is a need for your child to self-isolate, we will communicate with you in the usual<br>ways, via text message and email. |
| Getting a PCR test if<br>you have COVID<br>Symptoms                | You will have seen in the local news that some cases of the Indian variant have been detected in Nottinghamshire recently – this makes it even more important for people to keep getting tested and self-isolate when required. We have been asked by Nottinghamshire County Council to remind all parents that if anyone has any of the symptoms of COVID, they (and their household) should self-isolate and get a PCR test as soon as possible. This applies to people who are already completing the twice weekly Lateral Flow Tests.  |
| Covid Update   | Further to my email on 17 <sup>th</sup> May, we can confirm that when we return to school on Tuesday 8 <sup>th</sup> June, there will be a slight change to the rules around the school grounds with regards to face masks. It will be optional for adults to wear a face mask on the school grounds when dropping off and collecting their children. However, I am still advising caution and to have a face covering with you as this must be worn if you talk to a member of staff. Please stick to the guidance about not congregating on the playground and maintaining the social distancing rules Hands, Space, Face. Staff are being asked to continue wearing their face masks when talking to adults on the playground. The rules inside of the building have not changed, staff will continue to wear face masks in all communal areas and we are not allowing Parents/Carers in to the building more widely just yet.  |
| Absence Daily<br>Reporting Form<br>and<br>Leave of Absence<br>Form | <ul> <li>Unplanned Absence - during the last year we have introduced the Absence Daily Reporting Form that can be found on the Absence Reporting and Attendance tab of our website. This is the form to complete to notify us of your child's absence due to illness. It should be completed on each day of your child's absence. Please submit this form whenever your child is absent due to illness. If for any reason you are unable to complete the form then please send us an email or leave an answerphone message. However, the Daily Absence Reporting Form is the preferred method for you to let us know why your child is absent from school.</li> <li>Planned Absence - We have also created a Leave of Absence Form which should be used if you are requesting time off school in advance for your child for things such as medical appointments. Just to confirm, this is the form to use if it is a planned absence for your child.</li> </ul>  |
