Challenge 2 – Little Red Riding Hood

In the Autumn term the children will be re-telling the story of Little Red Riding Hood as one of their 1st pieces of writing for the new year. It would be helpful to look at this story and talk about it with your child over the summer holidays so that they are familiar with the story and feel confident when writing a retell of the story. You may want to discuss:

- the key points of the story
- characters
- what the characters say in the story
- the story setting
- vocabulary choices etc.
