PE Kits From September	<p>We can confirm that in September we will continue to allow children to come into school wearing PE kits on their PE day - feedback from parents has been really positive about continuing this approach.</p> <p>It is really important to please ensure that children are wearing the school PE kit only and not football tops and/or heavily logo emblazoned tops. A reminder of the school PE kit and all of the Round Hill uniform can be found on the school uniform page on our website. The PE kit consists of black shorts and a white t-shirt and for outdoor games in cold weather it includes a sweatshirt, jogging bottoms or tracksuit. Either plimsolls or trainers can be worn.</p> <p>We would also like to confirm that whilst stud earrings are allowed at school, these must be taped down on a PE day or during any sporting activity at school.</p>

	Information from the Department of Education
Measles Vaccination	<p>We have been asked by the Department for Education to remind parents to check that their children's vaccinations are up to day and in particular the measles vaccination. Measles can be very serious and spreads easily but is completely preventable with the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine.</p> <p>The first dose is offered to children at 1 year of age and the second dose at 3 years and 4 months. However, children can catch up on the MMR vaccine at any age so if your child has not had this vaccine you can contact your GP directly to arrange an appointment.</p> <p>More information about the MMR vaccine can be found on the Government website: MMR for all: general leaflet.</p>
