A settlement is a place where people live. settlements Pretty much every settlement can be classified as a city, a town or a village. Villages are small settlements with a small number of houses for a few hundred people. Most village villages are found in the countryside and may be surrounded by farms. A town is a larger settlement than a village. More people live in a town - normally a couple of thousand - so town they need more homes and more shops. Cities are the largest kind of settlements and often have millions of people living in them. Some people live in houses and city others live in flats or
