


Welcome to the Reception Newsletter


<u>Next Week</u>

<u>Literacy</u>

This week the children have been retelling the story of Izzy Gizmo. We started off the week looking at the characters and the problems they faced. We looked into new vocabulary such as malfunction, creation and invention. We then used our learning on perseverance from last half term to discuss how Izzy tried and tried again without giving up. Children have been writing sentences from the story and having a go at designing their own wings for the crow.

<u>Understanding the World, Expressive Arts</u> <u>and Design and Physical Development</u>
