

Maths

By the end of the week, we were having a go at adding by counting on and used towers of blocks to help us do this.

Literacy

This half term we are looking at the traditional tale, The Three Little Pigs. During this week, we are familiarising ourselves with the story, repeating reframes within the story and using Makaton sign to dual code it. We ended the week making a story map to help us retell the story in our own way. The children have been using puppets, making story circles and even started writing their favourite parts of the story.

This week we have introduced our first set of Phase 3 sounds including oo, ar, or. We have also practiced our segmenting and blending skills.
