

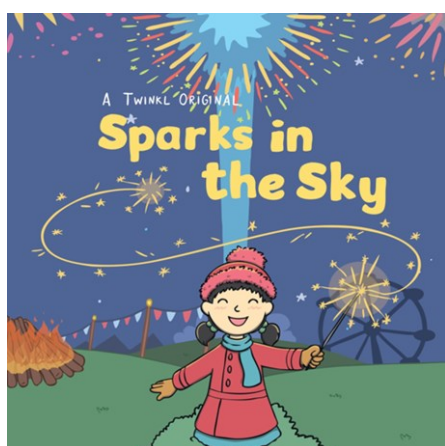

### Next Week

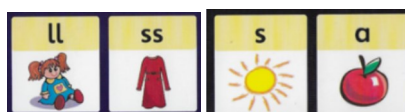
We will use our observational skills to explore how our environment changes as we transition from Summer to Autumn and Autumn to Winter.
