

### <u>Next Week</u>

## <u>Literacy</u>

Using our discussion on the four seasons, we have been writing about what we might see in spring, summer, autumn and winter. Children have been using their phonics skills to write consonant, vowel, consonant words. They have been challenging themselves to use these words to write a simple phrase such as 'a hat' or 'a sun'. A further challenge has been to write simple sentences starting with 'I can see...'.

#### <u>Understanding the World, Expressive Arts</u> <u>and Design and Physical Development</u>

In P.E. we have continued to work on and practise our fundamental movement skills including agility, balance and coordination. As it was Children in Need, we decided to do our activities to music and even had a little boogie at the end. Expressive arts has led us to use lots resources to make different weather pictures to show our understanding of what each season looks like. We have also been exploring the shape and colour of different leaves using leaf rubbings.
