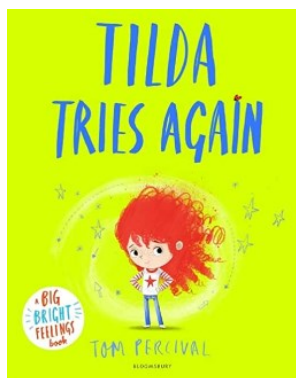

Maths

This week has been all about children seeing numbers and explaining how they see that number, with numbers up to 10. Numbers are made up of many different variations ($1+1+1=3$, $2+1=3$, $0+3=3$). The children have been exploring the many different compositions of numbers up to 10. We have also been adding two numbers together to explore number bonds and have continued to exercise our recall of one more and one less.
