Please follow the instructions carefully:

1. Recordings should not be longer than 60 seconds.
2. Make sure the people in the video give their permission to be recorded, as the videos will be used on the school website.
3. Make sure no-one else can be identified in the recording. The child's first name and music/song choice will be added in the final edit.
4. Recordings are best recorded on a mobile phone and can be uploaded securely to roundhillprimary.co.uk/upload
5. You will be asked to share the first name of the child, their Key Stage, and the piece of music title. (e.g. Simon Smith - Key Stage 1 - Jingle Bells)
6. The deadline for entries is 9:00 a.m. 11th December. Entries completed after this time will not be included.
