You might be wondering why they sport all those flashy colorful feathers rather than trying to blend into their background. The fact is, they're using all those colors as a strategy to stay safe. They are trying to trick their predators! Scarlet macaws have a type of coloration known as "disruptive coloration"

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## What is collage ?

## A piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.



## Items you can include in a collage?

## Buttons

Coloured cellophane
Coloured paper or card
Coloring book pages
Craft foam
Wool
Fabric scraps or felt
Fancy napkins


Feathers
Old magazines and comics
Newspaper
Sequins
Straws
Wrapping paper
Foil
Old birthday cards


Tissue paper
Wallpaper
Bottle tops and lids
Recycle old envelopes
Baking cases
Ribbon
Empty food packaging


Collect things and put them into colour groups e.g. blues, greens, reds.

## Step 1 - Parrot template



Use a pencil to write on your parrot template the colours you are going to use in your design. For example what colours will you use on the wings, tail, body and face. A little bit like colour by number. This will help you collect the right coloured papers later on.

## Step 3 - Gathering and sorting



We are going to be using scrap paper

Now that you have chosen your colour groups for your parrot you can collect the items you need. Remember, try to gather different shades of your chosen colour for example light blues and dark blues, like in the picture previously.
Top tip - work with one colour at a time. I started with blues on the bottom of the wing.

## Step 4 - Shaping the feathers



Lets go back to our design.
First draw a teardrop shape onto a piece of card to make a template.

Next cut it out and use the template to draw around, using different coloured scraps of paper included in your parrot design.

Example -Using a purple piece of scrap paper, I drew around the teardrop template lots of times and cut them out.

I placed them on the parrot and overlapped them to create a feather effect.

Don't worry about going over the edges, it's better if you do.


1. Draw round teardrop template on to scrap paper colour.
2. Cut out the teardrop shape.
3. Glue to parrot and build up layers. Try to overlap layers.

## Step 5 - Continue to build layers until complete



Continue to cut and stick the teardrop feathers onto your parrot. Remember to add different shades to add interest if you can. Glue and overlap the shapes to make it appear fuller. We can't wait to see all of your designs

## A3 Version for home learning

If you would like to use the A3 parrot version sheet I drawn it across 3 pages. If you would rather choose another parrot activity please see the next slide for ideas.


Step 1 - Print out the parrot body and cut around the shape carefully.


Step 2 - Print out both the left wing and the right wing. Put both sheets side by side and line up the parrot and glue it on top of the sheets in the middle. See next slide if unsure
