Now think about your animal.

What would it say to make the woodcutter listen?

You are now going to write a conversation between your animal and the woodcutter. First, let's remember what one of the animals in the text said to the woodcutter.

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
Now write a conversation between your animal and the woodcutter. Use the success criteria below to check that you have followed the rules for punctuating speech.

Success criteria

- *Inverted commas
- *Capital letter to start inside the inverted commas
- *Keep your inverted commas at the beginning and end of what is said
- *New speaker, new line
- *Make sure your speech is correctly punctuated. This includes a piece of punctuation before closing the inverted commas.
- *Include in your sentences information about who is speaking and even how they are speaking.
