<b>Reminder Regarding Visiting School</b>	<p>We would appreciate your ongoing support with keeping visits to the school office to a minimum. <b>Music Lessons in School</b>	<p>Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 children only: We have spaces in some of our private music lessons in school. <b>Car Park Barrier</b>	<p>You may have noticed that the school car park barrier is back in operation. A reminder that the car park is for staff only and parents should not be parking in the school car park. Your support with this is appreciated.</p> <p>In the school car park on 11<sup>th</sup> November, a car belonging to a member of staff was reversed into causing significant damage. If you have any information relating to this incident could you please get in touch with me at school?</p> <p>Finally, the car park is not a safe place for children to be, especially as the nights are now darker - a child was almost reversed into last week. I appreciate this is unavoidable at times due to the layout, but the children have been reminded today only to walk through the car park if there is no alternative and to be extra vigilant as cars are reversing. We would appreciate your support by reiterating this important safety message at home.</p>
