IMPORTANT REMINDER Track and Trace over the Christmas	REMINDER: It is very important that parents continue to let us know of positive Covid results even after we break up on Friday 18 th December. Parents/Carers need to be ready for their child to self-isolate should someone in their school bubble test positive after we break up. How do I Report a Positive Covid-19 Test Result? (Including During the Holiday) If your child receives a positive test result, even in the school holiday, you must complete our
Holiday	electronic form on the school website. The form is located <u>this link</u> . This is the same form we

use for reporting daily absence. Do not leave a message on the school answerphone as this will not be monitored during the Christmas holiday period.
In addition, if your child is self-isolating due to a member of your household receiving a positive result, should your child subsequently develop symptoms and also test positive, please complete the form to let us know.
How will you let us know if there is a positive test case when we are not at school? If there is a need for your child to self-isolate, we will communicate with you in the usual ways, via text message and email.
