<b>Half Term and INSET Day Reminder</b>	We break up from tomorrow, Friday 15 <sup>th</sup> October for two weeks. We return to school on Tuesday 2 <sup>nd</sup> November. Monday 1 <sup>st</sup> November is an INSET (in-service training day) for all staff. We will be working on our statutory safeguarding training and our school improvement developments. <b>ClassDojo</b>	I will be asking all teachers to ensure they take a break from ClassDojo over the half term break. If you need to get in touch with school during the half term, please e-mail the school office.
<b>Allergies in School</b>	<p>We have a number of children in school with severe nut and egg allergies and would like to take this opportunity to remind you not to send your child into school with anything in their packed lunch or any treats that contain nuts or sesame seeds. We are a nut and sesame free school. In terms of egg, we strongly recommend that children do not have any egg based products. It is vital that children do not share snacks or any food from their packed lunches so please ensure that your child is aware of this.</p> <p>The nut ban includes children’s packed lunches, specifically chocolate spread, peanut butter and anything containing sesame seeds. Please speak to your child’s class teacher for further advice. A child’s life is at risk should we not adhere to this. If your child has an allergy, whether very mild or more severe, please make sure that school is aware of this. Even if your child never stays for a school meal, it is vital that we have a record of this on our system. <b>Ingredients for School Meals</b>	Our school meals are made with fresh, local grown produce which are delivered to school regularly throughout the week. Unfortunately, we are not able to provide Halal meat. If your child requires halal meat for religious reasons please ensure your child asks their teacher for a vegetarian meal at the morning register. If for religious reasons your child doesn’t eat pork or beef but eats all other meats then they need to be registered for a special menu. If this applies to your child then please email the school office.
<b>School Menu on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November</b>	<p>When we return to school after the INSET day on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November, the school menu will be different for that one day and it will be the menu that had been planned for Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November. <p><b>Nottinghamshire's Consultation Admission Arrangements 2023-2024</b></p>	<p>I have been asked to share with you information from Nottinghamshire County Council regarding Nottinghamshire's annual consultation on admission arrangements. Please have a read of the below information that has been shared with us.</p> <p>The County Council, as the admission authority for community and voluntary controlled schools, is required by the School Admissions Code to determine admission arrangements annually. Any changes have to be consulted upon prior to determination. This year, the consultation for the admission arrangements for 2023-2024 for all community and voluntary controlled schools in Nottinghamshire will be open between <b>4 October 2021 and 28 November 2021</b>.</p> <p>The key proposed changes for 2023-2024 include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• review of relevant areas</li> <li>• change to the admission number for Carnarvon Primary School</li> </ul> <p>A summary of the consultation is available on our website on the Community Leaflets section which you can view by <a href="#">clicking here</a>.
