<b>Use of ClassDojo</b>	<p>I would like to take this opportunity to ensure everyone is clear with exactly what ClassDojo should and shouldn't be used for. For a full explanation, please refer to the <a href="#">ClassDojo</a> page on our school website. It is really important that you read this information so that you are clear who you need to contact in school with any questions or queries. The below list confirms what ClassDojo shouldn't be used for. Instead, all of the below questions should come via the School Office either by phone or email: <a href="mailto:office@roundhill.notts.sch.uk">office@roundhill.notts.sch.uk</a></p> <p>By all communication coming through the School Office this will ensure that communication reaches the correct person and is responded to in a timely manner. If you do ask an administration question on ClassDojo then please do not be offended when this is not responded to by the class teacher. <p><b>Diary Dates</b></p>	<p><a href="#">School Calendar</a> – Diary Dates for the Autumn Term 2022 are on the school website. We very rarely change dates once we have added them to the School Calendar, however if we do change dates, we will always let parents know.</p>																														
<p><b>School Opening Times</b></p>	<p>Please read the table below carefully to see the start and finish times for all year groups. The timings allow flexibility for parents to move from one playground to another at both drop off and pick up.</p> <p>You may remember that we adjusted start times and finish times due to COVID. We now feel it is the right time to return back to normal routines. Interventions will still take place between 8.30 a.m. and 8.50 a.m. for some children. 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<p><b>Parking Around School</b></p>	<p>Please can I take this opportunity to politely remind you about parking safely when dropping off and collecting your children from school. Please be considerate to our neighbours at all times. More information can be found on the <a href="#">How to Find us section</a> on the school website regarding places to park.</p> <p>Please ensure that you <b>do not park at The Pearson Centre or on Nuart Road</b> when dropping off or collecting your child unless you are dropping them off for an after school activity at The Pearson Centre. <b>You will get a parking ticket!</b></p> <p>A reminder that the car park is for staff only and parents should not park in the school car park at either drop off at Roundabout or at School. Your support with this is appreciated.</p> <p>Also, the car park is not a safe place for children to be. Please ensure your children do not walk through the school car park but instead use the path around the outside of school. Children have been taught they are not allowed to walk through the School Car Park and have been told to remind parents it is not safe to do so.</p>																														
<p><b>Bikes and Scooters</b></p>	<p>Please ensure no bikes or scooters are ridden on school premises. If children do come to school on a bike or scooter then they should push them as soon as they get to the school gates.</p>																														

<p><b>Flu Vaccinations</b></p>	<p>The Nottinghamshire Healthcare team will be coming into school in November and will be offering the Flu Vaccination to all children in school from Foundation to Year 6 inclusive. You will shortly be receiving an online consent form to complete if you wish your child to receive the vaccination.</p> <p>To find out further details about the flu vaccination you can visit the <a href="#">NHS website</a>.</p>
<p><b>New Home School Planners 2022-23</b></p>	<p>The school planners are packed with useful information about school. Please take the time to read the planner and familiarise yourself with the contents.</p> <p>The planner reinforces our school dress and behaviour codes and also has details of how you can support your children with their learning at home. Of course, rules are always referred to in the classroom on a day to day basis, but it really helps if the children realise we are all working together and saying the same things.</p> <p>Different classes may have slightly different ways of using the planners according to the age of the children, however all teachers monitor the planners weekly. If the information you have written in the planner is important please ensure your child hands it in to the teacher that morning so that any comments can be acted on promptly. Confidential matters should be written on a separate sheet of paper and put in an envelope.</p> <p>Parents are required to sign the planner weekly. The aim is to help your child be independent in their learning through encouragement from both home and school.</p>
<p><b>Home/School Agreement</b></p>	<p>Please take the time to read and sign the Home/School Agreement in the planner as this is being talked about in class. The agreement was devised by a working party made up of pupils, parents, teachers and governors. We are asking you to discuss the contents with your child and then sign it yourself. The children should then sign it as best they can to show they have understood. Thank you in advance for your support.</p>
<p><b>School Meals and sQuid</b></p>	<p>Our school chef makes excellent meals which are full of healthy local ingredients. To read more about school lunches on our school website and find the link to the Autumn Term menu, please <a href="#">click here</a>.</p> <p>All children in EYFS and KS1 (Years 1 and 2) are entitled to a school meal for free. The cost of a school dinner for children in KS2 (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6) is £2.40 per day. All parents with a child in Year 3 now need to start paying for school meals via your child's sQuid Catering Account. All parents should already have their sQuid login details but if you have any problems, please contact the school office.</p> <p>The website to access your sQuid account is: <a href="https://portal.squidcard.com">https://portal.squidcard.com</a> then you need to select the 'Catering Purse'.</p> <p>Please ensure your account is in credit at all times if your child is having school meals. Please note that we would never let a child go without food, however, where there are insufficient funds in the sQuid Account, you will be called and asked to bring in a packed lunch for your child. (In exceptional circumstances a child may be able to have up to 5 hot meals whilst you make arrangements for funds to be credited to the account.)</p>
<p><b>Snacks At Break Time</b></p>	<p>Children are only allowed fruit and healthy snacks at break times as it enables better concentration and certainly improves behaviour. All children in KS1 are provided with a piece of fruit. For our KS2 children we have our 'Healthy Snacks Tuck Shop' where KS2 children are able to buy a cereal bar or dried fruit. Items cost either 10p, 20p or 30p and children can bring in money for this each day. Alternatively, you can send your child into school with a piece of fruit/healthy snack if you would like them to have one.</p>

<p><b>School Dress Code</b></p>	<p>At Round Hill we follow a dress code, which allows a range of clothing options for your children to wear. Please check the <a href="#">School Uniform</a> page on our school website for a recommended list of options and ensure that your child comes to school suitably dressed. Uniform is available either with or without the Round Hill school logo. The information on the school website also confirms the details of our uniform suppliers.</p> <p>We believe that a uniform looks smart, wears well and contributes to a feeling of belonging to the school. We strongly encourage children to wear shoes with velcro fastenings if they are not able to tie shoelaces themselves.</p> <p>As you can imagine a great deal of learning time can be lost chasing up missing clothing and therefore please make sure all items of clothing (and water bottles) are clearly labelled with your child's name. We do our best to ensure all clothing is returned to its owner.</p>
<p><b>School Clubs</b></p>	<p>A range of lunchtime and after school clubs will be starting again soon and more details will follow shortly.</p>
<p><b>Coming Soon Playground Development</b></p>	<p>I am pleased to announce that, using some of the money raised by the RHA, work will start shortly on the large playground. The picture below is an artist's representation of what it will look like. It will address the drainage issue and replace the old wooden staging next to the climbing wall.</p> 
<p><b>Dogs</b></p>	<p>The Education Authority has recommended strongly to schools that dogs are only allowed on school premises for educational purposes or with pupils, staff or members of the public as a registered service dog. Please do not bring any other dogs onto the school grounds.</p>
<p><b>Amnesty on the Returning of School Equipment</b></p>	<p>If during the summer holidays you have discovered any reading books or sports kit which belongs to school then we will gladly have them back no questions asked! The equipment can then benefit other children. Equally if you have any books you are willing to donate to school that you think are suitable, then please send them in and staff will sort them into their appropriate age range. Thank you in advance for your help.</p>
<p><b>And finally ...</b></p>	<p>As with all school years this is an important one in the life of your child. If you would like to get involved in school life the date of the next Parents' Forum will be coming out soon.</p> <p>Round Hill is an exciting place to work.
