School Description (February 2025)

Round Hill Primary School is a large group 4 suburban school located near the town centre of Beeston which is south west of Nottingham. The school draws pupils from a mixed catchment area with a large proportion coming from private housing.

The school joined [Equals Trust](#) on 1st February 2025 and we work closely as part of a collaboration with other schools in the local area.

The school has a new Pupil Admission Number (PAN) of 75 and the current roll of 525 children is arranged across 18 mixed aged classes.

The school has extensive grounds which include a wild area, a nature garden, two football pitches and a large hard surface for playtimes. As well as the spacious teaching areas, there is a large assembly/gym hall, a multi-purpose dining area, an audio-visual room and a school library. The school is located on the same site as the local library this means that the school has easy access to an invaluable resource.

The Senior Leadership Team (SLT) is made up of the Head Teacher, a Deputy Head Teacher, and an Assistant Head Teacher - We also have Team Leaders for each phase in school.

Here at Round Hill we pursue excellence through a motivating, knowledge rich curriculum that promotes independence and engagement. Feeling secure, happy and confident in our learning environment means that our pupils develop their cultural capital alongside a passion for learning, and ultimately become ready for secondary school.

With a backbone of core skills in English and maths, our curriculum, which meets and exceeds all areas of the National Curriculum and Early Years Foundation Stage, is progressive, sequenced and ensures children's knowledge and vocabulary build on prior learning in a structured way.

The curriculum is purposefully enriched to consolidate and deepen learning, allowing children to apply new knowledge. Together with RE and RSHE, we focus on children's spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development (SMSC) and wellbeing through enriching the curriculum in a variety of ways; including a wide range of trips, visits/visitors, sports clubs, residential, themed days/weeks and external providers of specialist programmes such as Bikability.

The Governing Body is extremely supportive of the school and parents are very welcome in the classrooms to help the teachers. We are very much an open school with a strong community focus.
