

### Accommodation

- During our time on the residential, we stay in cabins not the big house, unfortunately!
- There are five cabins in total which are near to the sports hall where some of our activities take place.
- · Boys and girls will be in completely separate cabins.



### Accommodation

- Each cabin has a common area where children can relax and socialise before bed time.
- The cabins all have bunk beds for the children and a bathroom containing cubical toilets and cubical showers.
- Each of the cabins is equipped with a door alarm that we activate in the evenings before bed.
- If any of the external doors are opened when this alarm is activated, it sounds an alarm in the adult bedroom.



### Timings: Wednesday 19th November

- All children to come to school at the normal time and meet teachers in the hall.
