Vacancy in the School Office	We are seeking to appoint an Office Administrator to join our busy and friendly school office. Do you have administration and reception experience? Would you like to work in term time and have the school holiday periods off? If so, we would love to hear from you. The role is for 15 hours per week: 8.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on a Monday and 12.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. on a Tuesday and Wednesday. Helping Prepare your Child for the next School Year	 We have an extensive and well tried and tested transition programme, planned to ensure that the children feel confident and secure about the move to their new class/school next year. If you'd like help to support your child, then please read <u>our advice on this page of the school website</u>. If you don't get time to read the extensive information on the link the key points are: Talk to your child about the upcoming class/school change. Keep it positive and casual. Don't share your own worries. Normalize their feelings and offer reassurance. Encourage problem-solving and resilience. Use past successes to boost confidence. Let them express feelings through drawing or writing. Clearly explain daily routines and plans. 		
Transition Events	It is hard to believe that it's almost the end of the academic year and as you would expect, we have been preparing for the children to move on to the next stage in their learning journey for some time now. The staff have been busy completing their end of year Teacher Assessments and writing your child's report, which will be available electronically on Friday 11 th July 2025. You may remember we will have a different class structure next year. <u>Click here to reread the letter</u> that explained the details. We believe these changes will have a positive impact on every child's learning journey. There are several transition events planned which will aim to ensure your child is able to complete the current year and then settle well when they return in the autumn term. All of the below dates are on the school website already, but please make a note of these dates in your diary: 1) Class Swap Morning: Wednesday 2 nd July, 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 p.m. Children will find out which class they will be in for the next school year and will spend the morning with their new teacher and class. (Year 6 have their own arrangements planned.) For all pupils 2) After School Open Afternoon (for all pupils): Tuesday 15 th July 3.35 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. An opportunity for all parents to visit their child's current class teacher. Collect your child in the normal way and make your way to your child's classroom from the playground. <i>Followed by:</i> For EYFS to Year 5 3) Meet the New Teacher Events A and B (for Years EYFS – Year 5): (<i>This is the same event repeated twice in case you have children in different year groups</i>) Event A - Tuesday 15 th July: 4.00 p.m. to 4.20 p.m. and repeated again at Event B - Tuesday 15 th July: 4.25 p.m. to 4.45 p.m.		

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	The Meet the New Teacher Events are for parents with children in EYFS to Year 5 (i.e. Years 1-6 a September 2025) and will provide information relating to your child's transition to their new class		
	The aim of the 'Meet the New Teacher' event is to ease transition and to be familiar with the rou of the new class. All slides referred to during this event will be put on the school website afterw for any parents who are not able to attend.		
	If you are only attending the event at 4.00 p.m. and/or only attending the event at 4.25 p.m. please enter school through the main entrance.		
Arbor – School Meals	If your child is in Years 3-6 and has school meals, please remember to check your account weekly to ensure that there is sufficient money in your account to pay for the school meals. Arbor does not send reminders to you so you do need to check this and top up your account accordingly.		
Arbor Account for Year 6 Leavers	If your child is in Year 6, please start to plan how much money you need in your child's meal account to pay for meals until the end of term. If you have any money left in your child's account at the end of the school year then please email the school office at this point to request a refund.		
Sun Safety	At Round Hill, we want children and staff to enjoy the sun safely. We work with staff, pupils and parents to achieve this through: EDUCATION, PROTECTION and HYDRATION.		
	We frequently talk about how to be safe in the sun in classes and during assemblies in the summer term.		
	Our <u>Sun Safety</u> page on the school website has a PowerPoint presentation that the classes will be using. You may find it useful to take a look to back up these important key messages.		
	In summary: please apply sun screen in the morning before school, bring a named hat to school, remember to drink plenty of water and take regular breaks from the sun.
