Year 3/4 Expectations and Information

<u>Morning drop off and afternoon pick up</u>

Morning Drop- Off

• In the morning, children should be dropped off on the large playground. At 8:50 children will come into school to their classrooms and hang their things on their peg.

Afternoon Pick- Up

• Parents or Carers should collect children from the **large playground** at **3:35pm**.

• Children who attend Roundabout after school will go there directly from children's classrooms.

Homework:

Each half term we will post a homework grid, which will have details of the homework to be completed that half term. This will be posted on the school website and signposted to you on Class Dojo.



Writing Homework

- Each week the children will be set a grammar/punctuation homework for them to complete in their CGP workbook. This will be set each Monday and they should bring it in the following Monday to mark and be checked by their class teacher.
- Children will be taught the content of the homework that Monday.
- Teacher's will award children dojos for completing their homework.

Maths Homework

- Children will also have weekly maths homework set and this will be completed in their maths CGP workbook.
- Again this will be set each Monday to be completed by the following Monday. It will be on mathematical concepts that children are learning about in their maths lessons.
- Maths KIRFS (Key Instant Recall Facts); there will be a set of number facts per half term to learn by heart in order to develop fluency.






<u>Supporting your child at home:</u>

There are a number of things you can do to support your child's progress at home.

- **Reading** Your child will have a reading for pleasure book, please hear your child regularly, ideally everyday.
- **Learning times tables** your child will have log in details for the Times Tables Rock Stars website where they can practice their times tables.
- **Spelling** Spelling sessions will continue to be taught in class. However, there are lists of spelling words available on the website if you wish to do additional practice at home.









<u>Behaviour :</u>

- We are enhancing our interim behaviour policy by incorporating whole-school approaches like the *Zones of Regulation* to support children's emotional understanding and self-regulation.
- Our goal is to create a consistent and supportive environment where our provision supports positive behaviours and restorative practise.
- Logical and natural consequences are part of our restorative practise to maintain a safe, supportive and respectful school community.
- This will be launched with children and parents in the Autumn term.





<u>Rewards:</u>

- Children will be rewarded with petals representing the five values throughout the week.
- Children are also chosen for a certificate each week based on the five values, which will be handed out in the Friday Celebration assembly.
- Children will be congratulated on their achievements in class as well.
- Each class will also use dojos to recognise positive behaviour and achievements.







<u>Teaching and Learning – Maths :</u>



- White Rose White Rose Maths is a widely used teaching approach that helps children build a deep understanding of maths through small, manageable steps helping them develop confidence and problem-solving skills.
- **Class structure** Maths lessons will be taught in children's own classes with their class teachers. Most classes are single-age, with one mixed-age class. White Rose Maths provides mixed-age planning, designed to help teachers deliver high-quality lessons to classes with more than one year group, using shared learning steps and tailored resources to ensure every child is both challenged and supported.
- **Times table Screening** In the summer term, the children in Y4 have an online times table check. It is done on an iPad. The children will be able to have a practice first.



Teaching and Learning – Reading:

- In years 3 and 4, we want to promote a love of reading and we do this through our weekly Book Club sessions!
- The children's reading diaries this year will include reading challenges, recommended reads, and a wish list where children can record books they would like to read in the future.
- Teachers will continue to check planners weekly, so we encourage both children and parents to record what the children are reading so that they can celebrate, and share their views and opinions about the books they have read.





Teaching and Learning – Reading:

- In Lower Key Stage 2 (LKS2), we will have daily whole-class reading sessions to develop children's comprehension skills and explore a wide range of books.
- There are plenty of opportunities in Years 3 and 4 to read for pleasure.. Each child will take a book home from school and have access to a great selection of books in their class reading corners, which are regularly refreshed. Additionally, each class will visit the library once every half term. Library visit dates will be uploaded onto the school website.


<u>Teaching and Learning – Topics :</u>

<u>Teaching and Learning – P.E :</u>
