



# Year 1 Unit 3- Science – Amazing Animals.

Reptiles and amphibians have some similarities. For example, they are both cold-blooded and both lay eggs.


They also have some differences, like...

Reptiles have dry, scaly skin.


Amphibians have soft, moist skin.

Humans are mammals!




## Lesson 5: Can we identify different birds?





## Lesson 6: Can we compare different fish?

Animals from different groups can share some of the same characteristics:




## Lesson 8: What do animals eat?

omnivore


Animals that eat other animals.

Animals that eat plants.


Animals that eat plants and animals.

Some animals are good to keep as pets, and some are not.




## Lesson 10: What are the basic parts of the human body? What do they do?
