<p>CRITICAL READ</p> <p>Hot Topic for E-Safety</p>	<p>This week, more than one million Australian kids have been released from an experiment they never chose. In a world-first move, Australia has raised the minimum age for social media to 16 – and deactivated underage accounts.</p> <p>A whole generation has been protected from platforms that profit from their stress, their sleep and their self-worth. It will not fix everything, but it gives young people a few more crucial years free from addictive, profit-driven platforms – and shows Big Tech is not above the law.</p> <p>It may prove to be one of the most consequential public health interventions of this generation.</p> <p>Australia has a proud history of leading where others eventually follow:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ First seatbelt laws (1970) ➤ First plain cigarette packaging (2011) ➤ Now the first nation to draw a hard line on social media for teens <p>Other countries are already moving too: Denmark → raising to 15, Norway → raising to 15, Malaysia → raising to 16, Spain → raising to 16 to name but a few.</p> <p>Two weeks ago, the European Parliament passed a resolution urging member states to raise the minimum age on social media platforms to 16. Indonesia, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea are shaping draft laws too.</p> <p>A global rethink is under way. 75% of UK adults back it and 67% of 16-29-year-olds do – the very ones who grew up inside the experiment are warning us not to repeat it.</p> <p>If you want to get involved and find out more then click here and sign up to the Smart Phone Free Childhood and help protect the pupils of Round Hill.</p>
