Hot Topic/s for E-Safety: Safer Internet Day And Mental Health week	<p>1) It's safer internet day today, Tuesday 10th February, with celebrations and learning based around the theme 'Smart tech, safe choices – exploring the safe and responsible use of AI'.</p> <p>The remarkable growth of generative AI tools like ChatGPT has opened up exciting new opportunities for young learners. Used wisely, AI can be a powerful ally in boosting creativity, learning and problem-solving skills. However, without proper guidance, young people may stumble into challenges including inaccurate information, data security risks, and a growing reliance on AI over their own critical thinking.</p> <p>Click here to see the parental guide to using AI - from setting clear usage boundaries to teaching digital hygiene and promoting independent thought, this guide offers parents and educators practical advice on the safe, positive use of AI.
