| <p>Hot Topic for E-Safety: Changes to Online Safety – What Parents Need to Know</p> | <p>New measures are being developed to help keep children safer online. While these changes are being led at a national level, it is important for families to understand what they may mean for children at home.</p> <p>We encourage all parents and carers to take time to review how digital devices are used within your household, so you can support your child to stay safe online. – The Trust have asked me to mention an app called Discord, there are serious safeguarding concerns that we encourage you to investigate. You may have also seen in the news that the UK government is introducing plans to strengthen children’s online safety. These proposals would require technology companies to take further steps to prevent under-18s from accessing or sharing explicit images on their devices.</p> <p>This could include built-in protections on smartphones and tablets (such as those made by Apple and Google) to help prevent children from taking, viewing, or sending inappropriate content. Adults would still be able to access this content, but only after age verification checks. These measures are designed to reduce the risks of children being exposed to harmful material, as well as to prevent the sharing of inappropriate images among young people.</p> <p>Further details are expected in the coming months, so we encourage parents to stay informed. As always, the most important protection is open communication—regular conversations with your child about how they use technology and how to stay safe online.</p> |
| <p>Safeguarding Tips for Parents and Carers</p> <p>Water Safety – Drowning Prevention Week 13th – 20th June 2026</p> | <p>Just before half term I spoke to the children in assembly about the dangers of swimming in open water. I know you will be as horrified as me about the tragic deaths over half term. Next week, during assemblies, we will be repeating some key message and diving a little deeper about how to stay safe around open water and in the home. We will be using the information on the two links below to help children understand the dangers that water may pose. Thank you for your continued support.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">2026 Round Hill Primary School – Parent & Carer Survey</p> <p>On that note, we are delighted to share the positive outcomes from the previous Parent and Carer Questionnaire that was sent out in November 2025, with 39 responses highlighting many strengths of our school. An overwhelming 95% of parents say their child enjoys school, and 100% feel their child is safe, reflecting our nurturing and secure environment. The quality of education is highly valued, with 90% agreeing that teaching is good and 85% that children are making good progress, while 92% feel supported in helping their child’s learning. Enrichment opportunities and communication are also praised, with 90% recognising our range of events and 92% finding bulletins and ClassDojo useful. Overall, 92% of parents say they are happy with their child’s experience, alongside 87% who feel the school is well led and managed, demonstrating the strong partnership we share with our families and our commitment to <i>Dream, Believe, Achieve Together</i>.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Click here to view the results</p> |
